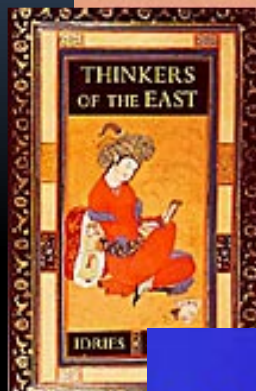


Teachings of Rumi (Masnavi I Ma'navi),

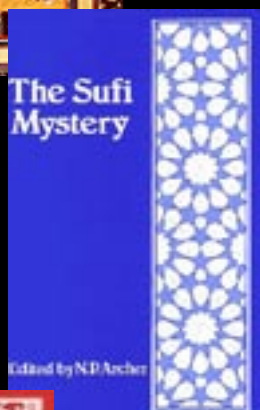

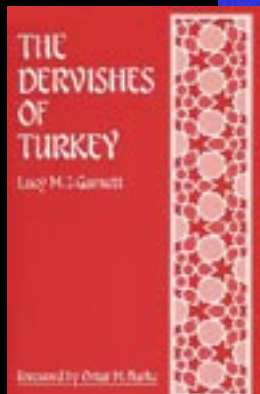

First published in 1912, this work presents information collected in Ottoman Turkey about the dervish orders as the author perceived them. In the foreword, Burke describes three types of books about Sufism: books written by the Sufis which are intended to instruct; books by "outsiders" who are "never aware of the method of extracting relevant materials from traditional ones"; and what he calls "museum materials" around which imitators in both East and West have tried to build whole schools.
